Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula



God's love is divine and merciful which is full of compassion and forgiveness.

In the opening prayer and the closing prayer of today liturgy, we are asked to share God's Mercy and life. We are Christians who wash away sins in the water of Baptism, are given new birth in the Holy Spirit and are redeemed by the blood of Christ. Our primary focus during the Easter season is to immerse ourselves in the paschal mystery. The opening prayer reflects this paschal faith and life.

All readings of today is about God's mercy and we need a trusting faith and forgiveness of our sins.

To be mercy, we need to be forgiving and cleanse heart, in the first reading today shows how the first Christian community live and share what they had. The community stressed on their acts of mercy practiced by the early Christians community before the Jews and the Romans who started persecuting them. They lived their lives by sharing love and compassion with the mercy of God through the teaching of Christ, so this witnessing community derived its strength from their community prayer like breaking of the bread and the teaching of the Apostles. It shows this community shared their faith and their possession.

Psalm 118 sings, ' Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting'. In the second reading from the first letter of saint John that Christians are children of God and show their love for God by keeping his commandments. John focus on practicing of obeying of the God old Testament commandments and the commandment of love like love others as Jesus loves us with a selfless and agape love. So, this love demands that we can treat others with God's mercy and compassion.

This second reading stresses that the Christian vocation to love and through faith in Christ, we have become children of God. And they can show their love for God by keeping his commandments and if they love God, they will surely love their fellow Christians, because they too are children of God. And through Baptism we share in Christ's victory over the powers of evil.

In today's gospel, we see the divine mercy of Jesus has given to doubt Thomas, when he touched the wounds of the risen Christ Thomas' doubt was turned into faith, saying, ' My Lord and My God'. The appearance of Jesus to his apostles showing them his wounds and give them his peace on them. Then he entrusts his mission to them by giving them the gift of the Spirit and the power of forgiving sin. Then Thomas professed his faith, ' My Lord and My God, John's gospel ended up today passage.

Today's gospel reminds us how Jesus, the risen Lord instituted the sacrament of reconciliation, a Sacrament of Divine Mercy., The Risen Christ gave his apostles the power to forgive sins with the words, 'Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained' (John 20:28). John illustrates here how Jesus showed his Divine mercy to doubt apostle and stresses on the importance of faith.

As we enter to this new week let us welcome the invitation of God to practice mercy in our lives and let us pray for the faith that we may always surrender to God our service of love for others.

May the Divine Mercy of God bless us all.
