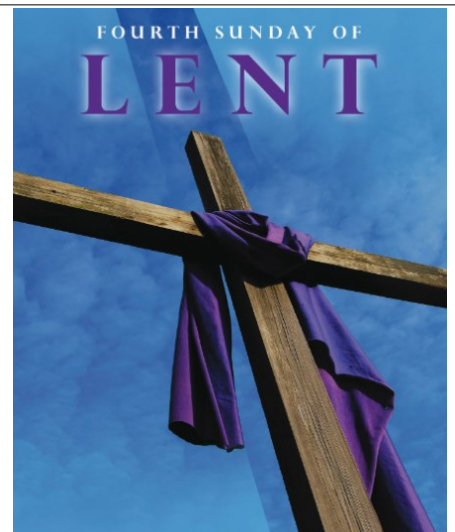
4th Sunday of LENT 27 March 2022

First Reading: Joshua 5:9-12
Psalm: 34

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21
Gospel: Luke 15:1-3,11-32

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

The Prodigal Son; Your brother here was dead and has come to life.



Traditionally this fourth Sunday of Lent is called Laetare Sunday, Rejoice Sunday, like anticipating Easter joy and all readings invite us to rejoice by reconciled with God through repentance and confession of our sins and celebrating our coming home to be with our loving and forgiving God. 'Father I have sinned against heaven and before you', so said the prodigal son whose story we hear today's Gospel. At the start of this Eucharist, we are invited to call to mind our sins, which means we are invited to make our own the words and the sentiments of the prodigal son. We see a clear theme runs through all three readings: God's mercy to sinners.

In the first reading from the book of Joshua, the people of God went to the promised land and kept the Passover. After the crossing of the Jordan, a repetition of the Exodus crossing of the Red Sea, the Israelites halt at the sanctuary of Gilgal. They there carry out the rite of Circumcision and celebrate the feast of the Passover. They have entered the Land; it lies before them. The promises of their God have been fulfilled. A new life in a new land begins for God's People. We see here the Israelites, free at last from the humiliation they suffered in Egypt, enter the land of promise and partake of its produce. A new era was about to begin. They mark their homecoming by celebrating anew the feast of Passover. This reminds us of the home coming of the prodigal son in the Gospel.

Psalm 34, taste and see the Lord is good, here this line is an appropriate response to the first reading's account of the first meal of the Israelites on the produce of the land of their destiny.

*Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue
Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom
Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai!*

Meals are very significant in Luke's Gospel. Nowadays we can hardly appreciate the deep significance of table-fellowship in biblical times. When a person had to grow most of their own food, to share table with somebody was an expression of sharing life. Hence the absolute shock of seeing Jesus eating with people regarded as sinners. The parable of the Prodigal Son reaches its climax in the contrast between the father who takes the wayward son back to the table and the elder son who refuses to do so. Today's Psalm might be heard on the lips of the forgiven prodigal. The banquet for his return was rendered all the more tasteful by the father's goodness. And it invites us, 'Glorify the Lord with me, let us together extol His Name!'

In the second reading the second letter of saint Paul to the Corinthians, God reconciled us to himself through Christ, that means Christ brought about a reconciliation between us and God. The Church's task is to bring the benefits of this to all people. The Church continues the work of reconciliation. The work of the apostle is to bring to men the reconciliation Christ achieved. The word of the apostle, the ambassador of God, makes reconciliation with God a present reality.

In today's Gospel, we hear the parable of the prodigal son shows that God delights in showing mercy to repentance sinners. So the banquet for the return of the second son was rendered all the more tasteful by the father's goodness. This father figure gives a human face to the mercy of God. Picture the relief and joy on the Son's face, reflecting the radiance of the father at the head of the table. The prodigal recalls the doubts and anxieties he had experienced before he was embraced in the father's forgiveness. He makes his own the lines of the psalm: 'This poor man called; the Lord heard him and rescued him from all his distress'. The radiant face of the Father invites us to an honest confession this Lent. Taste and see that the Lord is good. The home coming of the prodigal son, his shame also is behind him, his years of wandering are over and he returns home to a warm welcome and a great feast. A new and bright future lies ahead of him.

Jesus told the parable in response to the criticism of the Pharisees that he was too lenient towards sinners. They were meant to see themselves in the older son. For Luke the 'Pharisees' are righteous Christians, for whom God's mercy to sinner is unfair and scandalous. And the task of the Church is to bring the benefits won by Christ to all people. Today's Gospel invites us to avoid younger son. So let us admit the truth that we are assembly of sinful people, repentant, and now we are ready to receive God's forgiveness and experience Christ's presence in our own Holy Eucharist as our loving and forgiving God.
