Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

The Good Shepherd, I give my sheep eternal life



The Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday today we reflect on the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd who devotedly and kindly takes care of his flock. And the title pastor means Shepherd. So, what does a shepherd do? Shepherd leads, feeds, nurtures, comforts, corrects, and protects his flock, the responsibilities that belong to all the Church's Leaders, and all who are in charge of others. In today's Gospel Jesus, the Good Shepherd, says to us, 'I know my sheep. They listen to my voice and follow me'. Let us reflect for a moment on our failure to respond to the love and care of Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

In the first reading of Acts of the Apostles many became believers. During Paul's first missionary journey Paul and Barnabas came to Antioch of Pisidia, a town in Asia Minor. Paul and Barnabas preach the Gospel firstly to the Jews, but they reject it; then they preach it to the Gentiles who receive it with joy.

Psalm 100 sings, 'We are his people, the sheep of his flock'. The vocation to teach is a noble calling to remind people that the Lord is God, he made us, we belong to him.

In the second reading from the book of Revelation is contains a vision of those who will come through times of persecution to share in Christ's glory in heaven. It depicts Jesus as both the glories Lamb and the Shepherd. What John vision encourages his readers with the assurance that every person who has ever followed Christ and led others to him and who has suffered rejection and persecution will also know the unending joy of victory and have a share in everlasting life.

In today's Gospel is about Jesus as Shepherd. 'The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice; I know them and they follow me'. It is a day for praying that the church will not lack people who answer the call of the Lord to dedicate their lives in God's service. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, will not allow anyone to snatch from his care the sheep the Father has given him. Jesus is the true Shepherd and will not allow anyone to snatch from his care the sheep that belong to him. He will give them eternal life. What does belonging to him entail? It entails listening to his voice and following him. He explains that the mystery of who he is can only be grasped by the insight of faith. He illustrates his role by the image of a shepherd. His sheep know him because they belong to him. He assures those who do belong to him that none of them could ever have this bond of faith broken by any hostile power.

I can say that everyone who is entrusted with the care of others is a shepherd. like pastors, parents, teachers, doctors, nurses, government officials, etc., they are all shepherds. And we become good shepherds by loving those entrusted to us, praying for them, spending our time and talents for their welfare, and guarding them from physical and spiritual dangers. Parents have careful of their duties giving their children good example through the way they live their lives Mother and Father (husband and wife) and as parents. The flock is an image of community, Jesus knew this, that's why he wanted his followers to live as a community. In community we find mutual support, encouragement, and companionship. We can't belong to Jesus without belonging also to his flock. The privilege of belonging is not something that is offered to a chosen few, but to everyone, Jews and Gentiles.

Report on the Parish Synodal process

A further elaboration on our response to the synodal questions:

"We the people of this parish journey together. We journey with different kinds of people. Different ethnicity, different cultures and education, young and old, all walks of life, children, youth and adults with our Parish priest, the parish council, the caring group and the different ministries."

"The particular Church where journeying together happens is our parish, a small urban parish with a very multi-cultural population/congregation. The sense of community is strong; Newcomers are made feel welcome and invited to participate and use their gifts. Each individual is valued, regardless of their status."

"In short we are many members and one Body".

"Togetherness, caring and compassion are strong principles"

"We acknowledge our beliefs and understanding. We share our faith in different ways. We also learn to accept our faith from different angles."

"The parish is committed to both bi-culturalism and multi-culturalism. Maori prayers are always included in the Mass. With members from many countries a multi-cultural group (part of the pastoral council's committees) meets to plan multi-cultural liturgies, learning one another's hymns and customs. An altar cloth representing all the flags of the parishioners' home countries is used on special occasions. Some separate ethnic masses are held but there are no competing choirs."

We recommend this way of journeying together to all parishes.
