New standards of Goodness

Today's readings challenge us to choose freely and wisely to observer carefully about the laws given by a loving and caring God. In the Old Testament, He revealed His laws to

His chosen People through Moses and the prophets, and in the New Testament, through His only Son Jesus Christ. For Israel Torah is the teaching intended to promote the holiness and wholeness of each believer.

The first reading from the book of Sirach views that God has given us the freedom to choose to do good or evil, to choose life or death. Psalm 119 sings,' Happy are they who follow the Law of the Lord'.

The second reading a first letter of saint Paul to Corinthians that the true wisdom comes from God and reveals the wonderful things God has prepared for those who love him.

In today's Gospel, Jesus proposes new standards of goodness for his disciples. He said he did not come to abolish the laws and the prophets but to bring them into completion. He is relocated the


Northcote Takapuna Methodist Parish is having a free community meal on Saturday 25th of February at the Northcote Citizens Hall at 5.30pm.
