

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

Be holy, for I the Lord, your God, am Holy



Today's reading explains to us why we Christians are expected to be holy and how we are meant to become holy people. What our first and second readings give us reasons why we should be holy, and the Gospel of Matthew describe for us four ways we do then becoming holy people Jesus prescribes for us in using three examples of graceful Christian retaliation when people offend us with violate our rights and privileges.

In the first reading from the book of Leviticus advice we imitate the holiness of God when we refuse to exact vengeance or bear a grudge against another. Through the command given to us by God through Moses: Be holy, for I the Lord, your God, am Holy' then it also shows to us the way to share in God's Holiness: to Love your neighbour as yourself'.

Psalm 103 is the psalm of Divine forgiveness. The Lord is compassion and love slow to anger and rich in mercy. It challenges us to be holy as our God is Holy by becoming kind, merciful and forgiving, as God is to us. The challenge is to be perfect just your heavenly Father is perfect.

In the second reading a first letter of saint Paul to Corinthians, he gives us a profound reason why we should be respect one another, He gives an additional reason to be holy, by we are to keep

our bodies and souls holy because we are the temples of God, individually and collectively the Holy Spirit lives in us. This is the basis of our unity.

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! In today's Gospel, Matthew gives what differentiates the disciples of Christ different from others is their will-ingness to love as God loves. Here, Jesus teaches us four ways of becoming holy as God is holy. In Leviticus commandment: 'You must love your neighbour as yourself', Jesus broadened it to include everyone, Gentiles as well as Jews, enemies as well as friends. Why? Because this is the way the Heavenly Father acts. He

shows equal love towards good and bad, not because he is indifferent to morality, but because he loves without limit. Let us acknowledge that we know how difficult love can be, especially in relation to people we don't like. But Jesus says Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that the agape love, love without limit, Because the only thing that the world know that you are my disciples is




We share our food bank with the 45 families resident with us, but also with a growing outreach in the local communities and includes elderly pensioners.
