

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

Christ, the light of the World

Today's Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as 'Laetare (Rejoice) Sunday expressing the Church's joy in anticipation of the Resurrection of our Lord. We walk in the darkness



In the first reading first book of Samuel saying, God chose David, the least of Jesse's sons, to be king of Israel. While people look at appearances, God looks at the heart. In the presence of the Lord God, they anointed David king of Israel. Many centuries later, Jesus too will call himself a shepherd, demonstrating that his mission is grounded in tenderness and compassion.

Psalm 23 is the shepherd's light, and is used to accompany the first reading, is the much-loved shepherd psalm. One task of the shepherd is to be the eye of protection for the flock and that is the task of the shepherd and of Jesus himself is to take care of the whole flock, the entire people of God.

The Lord is portrayed as one who tenderly cares for the sheep, feeding and protecting them all the days of their lives. In the second reading, Saint Paul tells the Ephesians that now that Christ has enlightened them, they must adopt a lifestyle in keeping with their new state.



In today's Gospel, Jesus, the light of the world, not only give sight to the physically blind, but the light of faith to the spiritually blind. The Gospel story is a lesson on growth in faith. The climax of the story comes when the man makes a profession of faith in Jesus, 'Look, I believes'.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! His journey from blindness to sight symbolises the journey from unbelief to faith, which is a journey from darkness to light. Saint Paul says, 'Once you were in darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Sadly, while the blind man opens more and more to the light, the Pharisees, who are physically sighted, become more and more spiritually blind. In giving sight to a blind man Jesus shows that he is 'the light of the world'. When we, like the newly enlightened man of the Gospel, believe in Jesus as our Lord, our lives are in constant contact with the source of true light. Faith enables a person to travel through life with expanded vision, seeing with the eyes of God. He guides us along the right path.

Let us ask the Lord to open our eyes to see and to grow continually gaining clearer vision about God, ourselves and others. So, our Lenten prayers and sacrifices should help to heal our spiritual blindness so that we can look at others, as the children of God, and love them as our own brothers and sisters saved by the death and Resurrection of Christ.



Food Bank Depleted! Can you help? Our shelves are looking bare in most products.



Foodstuffs – med-large tins of tuna/ salmon/tinned corned beef, pasta sauces, meal sauces, tea, coffee, milo, long-life milk, biscuits, crackers, muesli bars, cereal, rice, jam, honey, peanut butter.

Personal care – shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, toilet paper.

Household – laundry and dishwashing liquid, spray and wipe. Donations can be <u>dropped off at De Paul House</u> Office at 92-96 Onewa Rd, Northcote.
