The Eyes of Faith



Today is the Sunday of Divine Mercy, the Octave Day of Easter. In today's Gospel we meet Doubting Thomas. Each of us has something in common with Doubting Thomas, because at times we too are troubled by doubts. Instead of denying our doubts, let us bring them to the Lord. From Creation, God has revealed his nature as love itself, in Holy Scripture and most perfectly in the life, Passion, death and Resurrection of the Son, Jesus Christ, Pope John Paul II in his second encyclical letter called Dives in Misericordia (Rich in Mercy) offers an extended meditation on the mystery of God's mercy, which he calls 'the greatest of the attributes and perfections of God' (Dives in misericordia 13).

He returned to this theme throughout his pontificate: As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness, and fear, the Risen Lord offers His love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love, It is a love that converts hearts and give peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. The early Christian community was

characterised by worship of God and loving service towards one another.

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka -Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! Psalm 118 sings,' Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting'. God always triumphs. The resurrection is the greatest proof. The breathing of the Spirit announces the grace of forgiveness. It is resurrection time, time to move on, a season of the Spirit, of grace and of rising. This day was made by the Lord; we rejoice and are glad.

In the second reading in the first letter of Peter, faith in the resurrection of Jesus is the basis of our hope of eternal life, a hope which enables us to bear patiently the trials of life.

In today's Gospel, When Thomas touched the wounds of the risen Christ, his doubt was turned into faith. The pierced body of Jesus offered to Thomas, is evidence that the crucified Christ is now the risen Lord. The only response to such a life-giving presence is Thomas' recognition of who it is that he dared to question: 'My Lord and my God'. We are being asked to recognise the greatness of the gift we have been given: 'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe. As we celebrate our Sunday liturgy, we can rightly claim that we have not seen, and yet we believe.

So may the ongoing story of our Christian journey always show that our belief in Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God, has given us life in his name. As Father sent him, so now he is sending us. May Christ presence to us also lead us to confess: 'My Lord and my God'.
