Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

The Road to Emmaus

One of the loveliest stories in today's Gospel is the story of how the risen Lord joined two of his wandering disciples on the road to Emmaus. He

explained the Scriptures to them and revealed himself in the breaking of bread. The same thing happens for us when we celebrate the Eucharist. Jesus speaks to us in the Scriptures and nourishes us in Communion.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, on the feast of Pentecost, Peter preaches to the Jews about the Resurrection Christ. Psalm 16 sings, 'Lord, you will show us the path of life'. And the fullness of joy in your presence, at your right-hand happiness forever.

In the second reading from the first letter of saint Peter, the benefits we enjoy as Christians were won by Christ through the shedding of his blood. Our response should be a life of holiness.

In today's Gospel, the risen Christ joins two of his wandering disciples on their journey and shows them that it was by dying that he entered into glory. What we find out in Luke's Gospel today of his deliberately uses eucharistic language: Jesus took bread, blessed, broke, gave it to them. These two disciples decided they have had enough of the journey to Jerusalem and all the events which occurred there. They are walking to Emmaus: seven miles away from Jerusalem. They are leaving the place of God's presence to them.



They walk of their Emmaus exemplifies how the Risen Lord is on the road with us, even when something prevents us from recognising him. Their story begins with the numbing news of what happened in Jerusalem the previous Friday.

LORD, SHOW US THE PATH OF LIFE.

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! They have turned their back on Jerusalem, their faces are downcast, and they confess that they have lost hope. And the Lord drew their minds back to the scripture enabling them to understand the events of life and life's events helping them to understand the scriptures. The events of the previous Friday have not changed but their understanding of it has.

Many distractions and obstacles prevent us from recognising the Risen Lord on our road. Daily pondering on the scriptures keeps the Lord ever in our sight. We see with new light: our hearts beat with new joy. Jesus does not abandon them. He journeys with them, and instructs them through the Scriptures, showing them that it was nec-

essary for the Messiah to suffer and die. At the end of the day, they invite him to stay. At table Jesus took the bread and said the blessing; then he broke it and handed it to them. The wandering disciples recognise the Lord in breaking of the bread, and immediately return to Jerusalem with their stories that 'the Lord has risen' and now they have come home.

How often do we find that the demands of the Lord are too much for us? We too walk away from our Jerusalem, where the action of God can be difficult to cope with, especially as it sometimes runs contrary to our own hopes. Reading the story of the breaking of the bread at Emmaus we are strengthened in our faltering faith. Jesus sets out to walk with his wandering disciples of all times. He instructs, and he breaks bread with us. and in this way, he leads us home.


Personal care – shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, toilet paper.


