Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

The commandment of love



In today's Gospel Jesus says to us what he said to his apostles: 'If you love me, keep my commandments'. We cannot truly call ourselves his disciples if we do not listen to his words and make an effort to live by them. We know we fail, and our lives are the poorer for that. We need the Lord's help to do better.

In the first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, we learn about the joy and enthusiasm with which the Samaritans received the Gospel.

Psalm 66 sings, 'Let all the earth cry out to God with joy'.

In the second reading, Peter encourages the Christians to remain steadfast under pressure in their attachment to Christ.

In today's Gospel, we hear that to love Christ is to listen to his words and, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to put them into practice in our lives. He said: 'If you love me, you will keep my

commandments...Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him '(John 14:15,21).

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! If we really truly love him we keep His two great commandments of love. First, to love God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our mind and with all our strength. Second is to love our neighbour as ourselves (Matthew 22:37-39).

What great wisdom from our Lord, However, despite this constant invitation of Jesus to love God and love others, our world today seems to be centered on worldly allurements rather than on God. Jesus challenges us to lead upright lives by doing daily acts of love. Our love for God must show itself in our care and concern for others. And our care and concern for others indicates our love for God. Mother Teresa relates how she was deeply touched by a testimony of love from a little child who gave something to her. Like this little child, let us become living examples of love for God and for others. We are Eater people. Let us proclaim the love of the Risen Lord all the days of our lives.

Jesus promises the Apostles about the Holy Spirit, who he is and his roles are and how we can experience Him in our daily lives. Jesus is going to give his disciples who obey his commandment of love the gift of the Holy Spirit. The role of the Holy Spirit as the Divine Advocate will instruct us in Jesus' doctrine and illumine our minds to receive deeper knowledge of our faith. It is also enable us to defend our faith when we need. The Holy Spirit will guide us in a proper practice of true Christian love by enabling us to recognise Jesus in the poor, in the sick, in the homeless, in the marginalized, in the outcast, in the drug addicts, etc., and also to become agents of healing and reconciliation in a broken and divided world. It is good that we are not alone, the gift of Jesus' Spirit is with us to guide and to instruct.


Personal care – shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, toilet paper.
