The Treasure of the Kingdom

Today's readings teach us to have faith in Jesus as our God and Saviour and sacrifice everything we have in life to do the will of God is equivalent to discovering and possession the most

valuable treasure like the pearl of great price. And it like keeping our personal relationship with Jesus and remain in the state of grace and sharing that life is the most beautiful and most precious things to have in the world.

In the first reading from the first kings told by God that King Solomon could have any gift he wanted, then Solomon chose the gift of wisdom. He asked for the great treasure of accepting the wisdom of God to rule his life by doing His will. That is the gift of prudence that is to understanding heart to distinguish right from wrong'.

Psalm 119 sings, 'Lord, I love your commands'. The psalmist regards the law not as a restricting burden but as a gift of God's wisdom to guide us on our road of life. That is why I love your commands more than finest gold.



In the second reading from a letter of saint Paul to the Romans, he predestined us to become true images of his Son.

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! Those who love God can turn everything to their spiritual advantage. What Paul teaches us that 'all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to His purpose'. This is true of all who accept a close relationship with God as their greatest treasure.

In today's Gospel, What God offers us is so precious that it is worth everything we have. The kingdom of God is something of extraordinary value, like a hidden treasure or a costly pearl. And possessing that treasure demands from us a total commitment if we are to preserve it. That means, the kingdom of God is God's reign in our hearts, in our lives, in our homes, in our community, in our society and in our world. The kingdom of God is worth investing everything we have to acquire it, but we need the wisdom that comes from God to see this. So only those who develop a searching mind and heart willing to give up everything for the great treasure of God's kingdom will be rewarded. So, what Jesus teaches us today is that the identity of God's will and living according to the Gospel, are the most precious and worthwhile things in life. Lord, Jesus forgives our sins, we allow you to be in our heart today, meditating in your words, nourishing our souls and receiving you in the Holy communion.


Personal care – shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, toilet paper.
