Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

Peter's Profession of Faith

Christ chose Peter to be the chief shepherd of his flock. Though Peter has strengths he also had weaknesses. We too have weaknesses.

When those weaknesses cause us to fall, Christ forgives us and helps us go forward again. In all three readings today are all about God is the source of all authority. God shares His authority with civil rulers elected to serve the people. And for the Pope and the other church leader's authority for material and spiritual welfare of His children.

In the first reading from the book of Isaiah, Isaiah tells us how God hates the unfaithful and selfish officials, and He removed the proud from his office taking from Shebna which he had proven unworthy and gave both to the humble and faithful Eliakim. The robe, the sash, and the keys are the insignia of this office.

Psalm 138 Sings, 'Lord, your love is eternal; do not forsake the work of your hands'. Here, David thanks God for having raised him from lowly origins and given him authority as king over the people of Israel. This psalm becomes a prayer for the Church and the successor of Peter.

In the second reading from a letter of saint Paul to the Romans, from him, through him, and in

him are all things. Here Paul praises God for the depth of His wisdom, knowledge, and correct judgments, asserting that He is the Source of all authority on earth and in heaven.

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! In today's Gospel, Jesus asks 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' Peter confesses Jesus as his Lord and Saviour. 'You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God', then Jesus approves Peter's words and gives him teaching and ruling authority in his church. Jesus establishes a 'Magisterium' in his Church to serve the spiritual and physical needs of the Church members. He made a statement: 'I will give you the keys to the kingdom of Heaven', he gives Peter and his successors the power to bind and to loose (make laws; exercise authority) in the Church, and the assurance that

their decisions will be ratified in Heaven. Even Peter himself failed the Lord, in giving authority to the man who denied him, Jesus wanted to show that he was establishing his Church not on human strength, but on his own love and faithfulness. The Church's true foundation is Christ himself. The Pope is his servant, not his substitute. Our today's gospel challenges us to accept Christ's authority as our Lord and Saviour like Peter did at Caesarea Philippi. Lord guides us in time of doubt, raises us up when we fall, and strengthen us when we are weak.

Have a blessed Sunday, God bless Fr. Aleki.

About the Mass

First Reading is an Old Testament Reading (during Easter from the Acts of the Apostles)

Readings are chosen from the Old Testament that anticipate or reflect the event or theme of the Gospel reading or the feast. During Easter Time, the first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles which tells the story of the Church in its earliest days.

Psalm (responsorial/common/unison/Sung)

After the first reading comes the Responsorial Psalm. This extension of the Old Testament reading is part scripture reading, part sacred music and part prayer The Psalms arose from the communities of the Holy Land and those in exile. The prayer recalls the saving events of the past, yet extends into the future, even to the end of history; it commemorates the promises God has already kept, and awaits the Messiah who will fulfill them definitively.

Second reading from the New Testament. The Second Reading comes from the New Testament and, while not always linked directly to the First Reading or the Gospel, it contains rich wisdom of what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ and his Church. These readings are taken from all the books of the New Testament that aren't the Gospels; the epistles, or letters from St. Paul and other disciples, the Acts of the Apostles and the Book of Revelation. While the Second Reading can be understood independently of the other two readings, it often enriches the lessons to be found in them.
