

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

Saying and doing

Today we celebrate Christ who obeyed his Father's will not only in word but also in deed. He obedient unto death. And Christ assures us that it is not too late to turn to God and do His will. So, our eternal reward or punishment or final decision for or against God,



In the first reading first from the prophet Ezekiel, he corrects two incorrect Jewish beliefs, first Children inherit the guilt of their ancestors and are punished for their sins. Second God is more strict than merciful, and through the explanation of Jesus in today's parable told that God will punish us only for our sins and God's mercy overrules strict justice. Hence each of us is responsible for his or her own conduct and will be judged accordingly.



Psalm 25 sings, 'Remember your mercies, O Lord'. It appeals to God's compassion and mercy, begging Him to wipe away our sins and to extend mercy to us.

In the second reading from a letter of Paul to the Philippians Our final choice for God, made by perfect obedience to Him, will be rewarded. There is no place of self-seeking and rivalry in the Christian community so we must imitate the humility of Christ.

In today's Gospel, actions speak louder than words. This is the lesson of today's parable,

the first son says no and regrets his refusal and goes to work refer to tax collectors and public sinners who refused to obey God's commandment but after listening to John the Baptist and Jesus, repent and became eligible for eternal reward. The second son says yes and does not go refer to the chief priests and elders of the people who claims religious authority have shown that when God's word is revealed to them in Jesus, they show no interest in listening or obeying. A heart of the discipleship is words without action are worthless so working in the Lord vineyard, is doing the will of the Father, when we say no, God gives us many chances of conversion, repentance and doing His own will.

### **About the Mass**

Institution Narrative: Consecration. The priest continues the prayer, giving praise and thanks, and calling upon the Holy Spirit to change our gifts of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. He then recalls the events of the Last Supper—the institution of the Eucharist. At this important moment in the prayer, we proclaim the mystery of faith. Several texts are possible, for example: "We proclaim your Death, O Lord, / and profess your Resurrection / until you come again." The priest continues recalling the wonderful deeds of salvation: the passion, death and resurrection of Christ.

**Prayer for unity and intercessions.** The grateful memory of God's salvation leads us to make a bold petition, our main one at every Eucharist: We pray for unity. "Humbly we pray, that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, / we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit". We then add prayers for the Pope and for the bishop of the local Church; we pray for the living and the dead and especially for ourselves that through the intercession of the saints we may one day arrive at that table in heaven. We look forward to that and raise our voices with those of all the saints who have gone before us as the priest raises the consecrated bread and wine and offers a toast, a doxology, a prayer of glory to God in the name of Christ: "Through him, and with him, and in him, / O God, almighty Father, / in the unity of the Holy Spirit, / all glory and honour is yours, / for ever and ever." Our "Amen" to this prayer acclaims our assent and participation in the entire Eucharistic Prayer.
