

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

The cost of Discipleship



Today's Gospel reminds us, Christian discipleship demand self-control that is self-denying, willingness to suffer that is take up your cross, and also readiness to follow Jesus by obeying his commandment of love and generosity in surrendering our totally life to God.

To follow Christ is inevitably to suffer: But there are great rewards too. However, we are weak and cowardly: Without God we can do nothing. Let us turn to God now asking pardon for our own failures and strength in our weakness.

In the first reading from prophet Jeremiah, we hear that he was speaking God's message to the people has brought Jeremiah nothing but insults, he is unable to remain silent. It explains how we Christian should practice true, dynamic Christian discipleship. And Jeremiah is a prototype of the suffering Christ.

Psalm 63 sings,' My soul is thirsting for you. O Lord my God'. The psalmist manifests his profound trust in God, just as Jeremiah does.

In the second reading a letter of saint Paul to the Roman advises them to present their bodies as

If you're sick, please stay HOME

a living sacrifice to God by explicitly rejecting the ungodly behaviour of the world around them, and to discern and do the will of God.

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! In today's Gospel, Jesus foretells his suffering and death, and tells his disciples that they too must be prepared to suffer. After Jesus correcting Peter's protest, then he announces three conditions of Christian discipleship: 'Deny yourself, take up your cross and follow me'.

In this he represents the typical Christian caught between faith and doubt, for whom the cross is a stumbling block. 'For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it' (Matthew 16:25). We should not be afraid to suffer and die for Jesus. Have a happy Father's Day may God bless all fathers today.


## This Sunday is the start of Social Justice Week!

# **About the Mass**

Gospel (priest or deacon)

The Gospel The high point of the Liturgy of the Word is the reading of the Gospel (the word Gospel means "good news"). Jesus Christ speaks to us! It is important to remember that when the Gospel is proclaimed, it is no longer the priest (or deacon) speaking, but Christ himself. Because the gospels tells of the life, ministry, miracles, parables, sayings, compassion, mercy and preaching of Christ, it receives several special signs of honour and reference.

- The assembly stands to hear the Gospel
- It is introduced by an acclamation of praise

  (Alleluia) · We respond by tracing the Sign of the

  Cross on our foreheads, mouths and chests in a

  symbolic gesture whereby we ask for the grace to

  keep the Lord's Word ever-present in our minds, on

  our lips and in our hearts.

**The Homily** is part of the Liturgy of the Word, in which the priest reflects on the readings, particularly the gospel, and relates it to our lives. After the homily there is a short period of silence as we reflect on what we have heard.
