

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

Compassion and Forgiveness

Today's readings concern forgiving those who wound us and being reconciled with them. All three readings remind us about the path to forgiveness, mercy, reconciliation and challenge us how to walk this, is the only way to Life. It is very clear in our today's Gospel,



Jesus says if we want God to forgive us, we must forgive others. We all know how hard it can be to forgive. At the same time, we know how lovely it is to be forgiven. We always begin our Mass by asking forgiveness for our sins. As we do so we should also ask for the grace to be able to forgive those who have sinned against us.

In the first reading from the book of Sirach. In refusing to forgive those who have sinned against us, we exclude ourselves from receiving God's forgiveness for our own sins. Here tells us that if his listeners don't heal and forgive and show mercy, they

can't expect to receive mercy from God in return.



Psalm103 sings, 'The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger and rich in compassion'.



In the second reading a letter of saint Paul to the Romans, the entire existence of a Christian is for Christ and for others. Paul reminds us that we have to forgive others because we belong to Christ who, by his own example in forgiving those who killed Him taught us how we must forgive in our turn. Since we are human as related to each other's as brothers and sisters of Jesus, so we are in the God's family so that hatred and bitterness toward anyone should have no place in our own hearts.

In today's Gospel, we must be willing to extend to others the generous forgiveness God has extended to us. In today's Parable Jesus teaches us that there should be no limit to our forgiveness and no conditions attached to our reconciliation. Peter thinks to forgive his brother is seven times but Jesus replies is seventy-seven times that means there is to be no end of forgiveness in the Kingdom (Matthew 18:24). We commit sins every day, and we need God's forgiveness every day. So, we must forgive in order to be forgiven. In the Lord's Prayer Jesus teaches us 'for if you forgive men their trespasses, your Heavenly Father also will forgive you'.

About the Mass

Liturgy of the Eucharist

The term "Eucharist" originates from the Greek word eucharistia, meaning thanksgiving. In the celebration of the Eucharist, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist consists of three sections: the Preparation of the Gifts, the Eucharistic Prayer, and Communion. We might describe these as setting the table for the meal, saying the blessing, and sharing the meal together.

The Preparation of the Gifts has rich symbolic meaning. Here the bread and wine and our monetary donations and food gifts for the poor serve as symbols of ourselves. The priest and servers prepare the altar, symbolically extinguishing the lit candles at the lectern and transferring the light to the candles on the altar. Members of the parish take up a collection from the assembly and bring it to the priest at the altar with the bread and wine to be used for the sacrifice. Our giving symbolizes our commitment to give our whole lives to God and to use all the gifts God has given us. The peoples' presentation of the gifts reminds us that we are al involved in this act of worship, presider and assembly together. The celebrant blesses and praises God for these gifts and places them on the altar. Just as the gifts and the altar are prepared, so we prepare ourselves to enter into the great blessing prayer and the meal that is to follow.
