

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

God's Justice and Generosity

Sometimes we often are small and petty in the way we think and act. Fortunately for us there is nothing small or petty about God. His ways are as high above our ways as the heavens are above the earth. Let us ask God for forgiveness for our smallness of heart, while at the same time opening ourselves to the goodness of God.



In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah, as high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are God's ways above our ways.

Psalm 145 sings, 'The Lord is near to all who call him'. The psalmist recognises many

qualities of God: greatness beyond measure, kindness, compassion and love in abundance. Above all, it rejoices

that God is always near. The Lord is close to all who call him.





Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! In the second reading a letter of saint Paul to the Philippians, writing from the prison, he is thinking of his death, and longing for complete union with Christ. For Paul's willingness to stop calculating what would benefit him and forego his personal preference, so he can imitate Christ and give to the Philippians.

In today's Gospel, We hear the story about the generosity of God, which soars above human standards. We reflect how Jesus dealt with sinners we can better understand God's justice. Recall how Jesus forgave the thief crucified with Him. He made simple request:' Remember me when you come in Your Kingdom' (Luke 23:42). He gives the good thief paradise; this reward attests of how generous God is as He welcomes sinners to His kingdom. Jesus tells us in today's parable that He can go beyond human justice. The Lord can give more if He wishes. His generosity has no bounds. God's generosity challenges us to be generous, too, we must be generous in love, mercy and forgiveness. We must be generous in our service to God and others.

About the Mass

Liturgy of the Eucharist

After the gifts and altar are prepared, the Eucharistic Prayer begins. This prayer of thanksgiving is the heart of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. It begins with the dialogue "Lift up your hearts" inviting us to join with the priest who gathers not only the bread and the wine, but also our lives and joins them to Christ's perfect sacrifice, offering them to the Father.

Next comes the Preface telling of the wonderful actions of God, both throughout history and in our lives, giving thanks to God for all these things. It concludes with the Holy Holy in which the whole assembly joins the song of the angels giving praise to the Father in heaven (cf. Is 6:3). We then kneel for the most solemn part of the Mass.

The next major part of the Eucharistic Prayer is the epiclesis (petition) where, the priest using the word "we" so involving us, asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit on the gifts of bread and wine so that, through the power of the Spirit, they may become the Body and Blood of Christ, and so that those who take part in the Eucharist may be one body and one spirit. He then recalls the events of the Last Supper—the institution of the Eucharist where Christ blessed the bread and wine and gave them to his friends as his Body and Blood. Once again the bread and wine become Christ's Body and Blood.
