Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

They do not practise what they preach



Today's readings invite and challenge us to be humble in committed loving service to others in the community without expecting honour or rewards in return. Jesus attacks on the scribes and Pharisees. He called them hypocrites because they didn't practise what they preached. Which of us can truthfully say that our deeds match our words? Therefore, to some extent, all of us are hypocrites. But each time we come to celebrate the Eucharist we are called by God to a life of truth and genuine goodness. Today's Gospel warns against hypocrisy and those who statusseeking in our Church community.

In the first reading from the prophet Malachi who berates the priests of his day for failing to live up to their calling. So, Malachi condemns the irresponsible, proud, lazy priests of his day.

Psalm 131 sings,' Keep my soul in peace before you, O Lord'. This Psalm is the prayer of those who know their place before God. This attitude before God results in the twin virtues of humility and trustfulness.

In the second reading a first letter of saint Paul to the Thessalonians, he reminds them of his love

If you're sick, please stay HOME

and care for them, and how hard he worked to bring them the Good News. That is, he presents himself as an ideal example of servant leadership in a serving of the Christian community.

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka -Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! In today's Gospel, Jesus launches a strong attack on the Scribes and Pharisees, but what he says is important for us too. His words go against the religious leaders who are more concerned of self-promotion than service to others. Jesus calls for integrity and honesty from those in authority, whether priests, parents, teachers or politicians. They should be in leader of no double standards but rather should grow a deep sense of equality with mutual respect. They should seek to serve other. It is a lament over those who reject the kingdom. So, a disciple must be a humble servant. 'Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven' (Matthew 18:4). The key attitude is that of humility. to have a 'humble in heart' (Matthew 11:29).

Have a blessed Sunday, God bless Fr. Aleki.
