Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

Look, the bridegroom comes, Go out to meet him

We come close to the ends of the church's liturgical year with texts about the coming of the Son of Man, which leads into the New Year with Cycle B and season of Advent, the season of 'coming' Jesus' future coming as the conquering Son of Man at the end of time and his past coming as the helpless infant in a



manger are the topics of our remembrance. Today's readings bring the usual warning about preparation for the end of our own world, the end of our own time, and our passage to another world. They tell us that a searching, watching, and growing heart in essential for a lively, dynamic faith in God. They ask us whether we are ready for these events and how we are preparing for them.

In the first reading from the book of wisdom, this sings the praise of wisdom, which can be found by all those who seek it. By seeking wisdom, we search for understanding and we are able to more clearly notice God's presence all around us in creation.

Psalm 63 sings, 'My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God'. This Psalm is about thirsting for God. It is the prayer of one whose life is totally centred on God, day and night. Every

part of the psalmist's life is reaching towards God like a flower towards the sun. His heart is longing for God, his soul is thirsting, please stay HOME and his body is pining like a dry weary land without water.

In the second reading from the first letter of saint Paul to the Thessalonians, for those who died as Christians, God will bring to life with Jesus. Paul consoles his converts at Thessalonians who are worried about the fate of their loved ones who have die before the return of the Lord. Paul assures that the death and resurrection of Jesus is powerful enough to save even those who have already 'fallen asleep'. Paul helps them to realize that they need to believe in what the Lord has done for us. He doesn't want them to fret.

Today's Gospel story urges us to stay awake because we do not know the day nor the hour of the Lord's coming. The point parable is this, since the disciples do not know the day nor the hour of the Lord's coming, they must be prepared so that when he comes, they can enter his kingdom. The wise virgins represent those who are prepared for the end times and urge all Christians to be

prepared to meet the Lord. To be prepared means to be a doer rather than a mere hearer of the word. Jesus' parable speaks strongly to our need to live our present with an eye on the future. It must be deeply committed to God's gift of the present, waiting for God's future gifts, and his final coming; and prepared to take all the risks of following his Son, Jesus of Nazareth, through the time in between.

Have a blessed Sunday, God bless Fr. Aleki.
