Christ the King **26 November 2023**

First Reading: Ezekiel 34:11-12,15-17

Psalm: 23


Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26,28

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

Our Lord Jesus Christ, king of the Universe

Today we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King to mark the end of the liturgical year A of the Ordinary Time. Today we say goodbye to Matthew and next Sunday we begin the season of Advent then we welcome Mark. There is not better way to end our reflections on the words and

deeds of Jesus then to reflect on the meaning of His kingship. Today's scripture reading revolves around the Last Judgment scene of Jesus Christ coming in glory and power. It was Pope Pius XI who brought the Feast of Chrit the King into the liturgy in 1925 to bring Christ as Ruler, and Christian values, back into lives of Christians, into society, and into politics. This feast was reminder to the totalitarian governments of Mussolini, Hitler and Stalin that Jesus Christ is the only Sovereign King.

In the first reading from the prophet Ezekiel. God is portrayed, not so much as a judge of his people, but as someone who cares for them as a good shepherd care for his sheep. It reminds us of Christ's claim to be the Good-shepherd-king, leading, feeding and protecting his sheep. Psalm 23 sings, 'The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want'. A servant king, the choice of the shepherd-psalm for Christ the king is significant. He came, not to be served, but to serve.

If you're sick,

The kings of his world are driven by the love of power, but Jesus preferred the power of love. Although he was Lord and master, yet please stay HOME he washed the feet of the apostles.

In the second reading from a first letter of saint Paul to the Corinthians, at the end of time Christ will reign as universal king, having overcome all hostile forces, including death.

In today's Gospel, We don't know exactly how the last judgement will happen, but we do know what the followers of Jesus will be judged on. Although Emperors and kings now exist mostly in history books, we still honour Christ as the king of the Universe by enthroning Jesus in our hearts, surrendering our lives to God. So, this feast challenges us to see Christ the King in everyone, especially those whom our society considers the least important and to treat each person with the same love, mercy, and compassion Jesus showed. Christ the king come in Heavenly glory to judge us, based on how we have shared our love and blessings with others through genuine acts of charity in our lives. What Jesus represent to us now not only as our Good Shepherd leading, feeding and healing his sheep, but also dwelling in those for whom we are. In today parable of separating of the sheep from the goats at the Last judgment, every person to whom we give ourselves, 'whether hungry, thirsty or a stranger, naked, sick, or in prison', is revealed to us as having been the risen Christ. Our reward or punishment depends on how we have recognized that treated this risen Christ in the needy.
