First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

Psalm: 51

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:7-9

Gospel: John 12:20-30

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula

The seed must die in order to yield a rich harvest

Today's reading focus on Jesus' death where St Paul consider as a priestly sacrifice and John consider as Jesus' moment of exaltation

and glorification. The reading challenges us as Jesus became the Promised Messiah of Glory and the conquering Son of Man who offer his life for others.


Jesus died for us, gives us courage strength and love. We too have to die to ourselves in order to live more fully as human beings and children of God.

In the first reading from the prophet Jeremiah tells us how God will replace the Old Covenant of Judgement with a New Covenant of Forgiveness of sins. This new covenant prophesied by Jeremiah was fulfilled through Jesus' life, death and Resurrection.

He tells us a shattered people that God has not forsaken them but will soon make a new and more intimate covenant with them.

Psalm 51 sings, 'Create a clean heart in me, O God'. The psalmist recognise his need for a new heart as he turns away from his shameful infidelities.





Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka -Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! In the second reading from the letter of Hebrews, through his obedience and suffering Christ became the source of eternal life for us.

In today's Gospel from John, in his death Jesus will be glorified and this will bring life to those who follow and obey him. Here Jesus accepts the cross as his 'hour' meaning the steppingstone to his passion, death, Resurrection and exaltation.

He considers his hour as the way his Father draw all people into the saving action of God. By lifting up of Christ on the cross later into Heavenly glory by Resurrection and Ascension is the assurance of our own exaltation and glorification provided we accept our crosses.

Unless a grain of wheat dies, it cannot bear fruit or unless we die to our own will, we cannot bear fruit for God. Let go our lives and let God do with them whatever he wishes. It is a good news when we imitate the grain of wheat and die to ourselves, we too will bear much fruit. As we are moving closer to the Easter may we have a good week preparing for the holy week.
