
Easter Sunday 31 March 2024

First Reading: Acts 10:34.37-43.
Psalm: 118

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Gospel: John 20:1-9

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula



He is risen from the dead alleluia!

Easter is the greatest feast of all. We celebrate the resurrection of Christ continues into Easter Sunday morning. Easter Sunday marks the end of the Triduum and is the first day of the Easter Octave. This is the day Jesus, our Saviour, broke the chains of death and rose in triumph from the grave. This is truly the 'Day of the Lord'. But it is our day too, for Jesus shares with us the fruits of his victory. So, let us open our hearts to the joy of this great day.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, this is part of an early sermon of St Peter. We hear Peter recount the story of the life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. While all he has accomplished has been witnessed to by the prophets, the redemption of the Risen Christ has been accomplished for all people, including the gentles. Anyone who believes and bears witness to him will be forgiven.

Psalm 118 sings, 'This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad'. God's mercy is not a onetime reality; it endures across the ages. God will protect those who believe, who are rescued through his power.

In the second reading from a letter of St Paul to Colossians, through our baptism we already share in the risen life of Christ, though in a hidden and mysterious way.

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! In today's Gospel, on discovering that Jesus' tomb is empty, the disciples begin to grasp what the scriptures had foretold, namely, that he would rise from the dead. The resurrection of Jesus was completely unexpected by his disciples, even though Jesus had told them on a number of occasions that he would rise from the dead.

Easter is about the resurrection of Christ is the basis of our faith. Easter is the guarantee of our own resurrection. Easter is a feast which give us hope and encouragement in this world of pain, sorrow and tears. Easter also gives us meaning to our prayers.

Let us live like a resurrection people not to buried in the tomb of our sins, evil habits and doubts but live in a joyful and peaceful life which always experience the living presence of the Risen Lord who loves us in all the events of our lives.
