
First Reading: Acts 3:13-15,17-19

Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula



Witness to the Resurrection

Today's readings challenge us to adjust our lives to the living presence of the Risen Christ as we grow daily more aware of the presence of the Holy Spirit within us and surrounding us. And this awareness will strengthen us in our hope in the promises bring us to true repentance for our sins and the renewal of our lives which help to lead us to bear witness to the Risen Lord by the work of charity. It also reminds us that the suffering, death and Resurrection of Christ was to save us from our own sins.

In the first reading from the acts of the Apostles, this reading is an early explanation of the Passion and an example of the early witness to the Resurrection. Where Peter shows great courage when he confronts the people with their part in the death of Jesus. The living Christ empowers Peter to heal a lame man in his name. He reminded the people who killed Jesus to repent of their sin and become one with Christ.

Psalm 5 sings, 'Lord, let your face shine on us'. It is a grand form of prayer to relax with the Lord at the end of the day to review the happenings of the day. This psalm is a model of what we need to touch. A good night's sleep brings great peace.

If you're sick, please stay HOME

In the second reading from the first episode of John saying, we show that we know God by keeping his commandments. But when we fail, Christ intercedes for us with the Father.

In today's Gospel, Jesus appears to the apostles, and commissions them to preach repentance and forgiveness of sins to all nations and to be witnesses to his resurrection. Every mission must always begin with personally encountering Christ. Mission is an important task of Christians. Only through it will they discover that the message of Easter has taken root in their lives. Without it, they will find themselves in a 'locked up room', their faith a useless appendix, unable to effect a transformation in their own lives. Let us live out in our ordinary lives our great joy in Christ of the Resurrection, and let us make God's word real in this world we live.
