Reflection by Fr Aleki Piula



All who live in me, and I in them, bear much fruit

Today's Gospel is about the vine and the branches, so, today's reading emphasizes on the need for us Christians to abide in Christ as a way for producing fruits of kindness, charity, and holiness. There is no such thing as a solitary Christian. Every Christian is linked to Christ and to all other Christians. This is the clear from the words of Jesus himself saying, 'I am the vine, you are the branches'. Alas, often we ignore and hurt others and live only for ourselves.

It is an invitation to commit more fully to the paschal mystery with the assurance that God's love will sustain us. All of our work is to flow from the example of Christ. We are to lay down our lives for the reign of God and for one another. We are to persevere in promoting the gospel of Christ, and we are to be agents of Christ's love to all of God's people.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells us about some of the trial of Paul endured after his conversion. This reading tells how three years after Paul's conversion, Paul went up to Jerusalem. In spite of being, introduced by Barnabas, such was the hostility he encountered that he had to be smuggled out of the city.

If you're sick, please stay HOME

The fact that Paul took all these trials in his stride shows the depth of his faith in Jesus.

Welcome - Malo e lelei - Bula Vinaka - Talofa lava - Mabuhay - Bienvenue Nei hou ma - Anneunghaseyo - Ayu Bowan - Willkommen - Welkom Haere mai! Nau mai! Whakatau mai! Psalm 22 sings' will praise you, Lords, in the assembly of your people'. This psalm speaks of the vindication of the Servant that occurs in his suffering.

In the second reading a first letter of saint John, here John is reflecting on Christ's commandment of love. So, what we have to do in order to be at rights with God, we have to believe in his Son, Jesus and love one another as he told us. Active charity is what distinguishes true Christians from those who are such in name only, And this is what makes them fruitful branches of Christ, the true vine.

In today's gospel, Jesus uses the image of a vine and its branches to illustrate how close are the trials that bind him to his disciples. So, we have the lovely image of the vine and the branches, Here, Jesus stresses the unity that exists between him and his disciples. Vine and branches need each other. The vine cannot bear fruit without the branches. And the branches can have no life if separated from the vine.

The branches need to be pruned by trials in order to be fruitful. If Christ prunes us through trials it is only to makes us more fruitful. Pruned by suffering, a person produces the fruit of understanding and compassion.

Have a blessed Sunday, God bless Fr. Aleki.
